Sunday December 6th, 2009 5:00pm - Santa will be at the annual town Christmas Tree lighting hosted by the Merrimac Light Department. Come have coca and cookies and enjoy the music and characters. Bring your camera to get a photo with Santa and tell him what you would like for Christmas. The event is held at Kimball Park, at the corner of Union Street and West Main Street.
